

I missed the meeting but am writing up items discussed after checking with board members.

Our finances are sound and only a few members are still outstanding on their payment of dues for this year. They have been reminded and will be dropped from membership if dues are not paid by Mar 1.

The Zeffy system of signing up for monthly lunches was initiated in January and worked amazingly well. Members were sent an invitation to the upcoming lunch meeting a couple of weeks ahead of time. When they sign up for lunch, members state their meal preference and pay by credit card at least two days before the meeting. This is done so that the Club Restaurant can be notified and prepare the proper amount of food. A word of caution is that once a member signs up and pays, it isn't possible to get a refund from Zeffy. So make sure that you can come to lunch meetings when signing up.

We'll be using Zeffy to sign up for the Valentine lunch on February 6 which will include ladies as guests. Include your guest by indicating two persons when signing up. Costs will be \$50/pp for prime rib and \$40/pp for salmon, pasta or salad. That includes a \$2/pp donation for use of Zeffy.

Upcoming speakers will be: Jason Balkarama from Marin County IT Security speaking on the risks of spam in February, Michael Dybeck from the Boy Scouts of America in March, and Kent Fortner from Mare Island Brewing Company in April.

Ted Pullen has arranged an outing for Wednesday May 7 to see the musical play "Mamma Mia" in San Francisco. The package will include bus trip from Marin, lunch at Max's Opera Cafe in SF and theater ticket for a cost of \$117/pp. Ted had support to set up this trip and the package was approved by the board. To sign up, send your check to Ted along with your choices for lunch. Ted has notified other branches of this upcoming trip so sign up as soon as possible. The limit is about 50 people.

The Board approved continuation of our usual slate of activities for the coming year. The walking/hiking group meets weekly for local hikes. The book group meets on second Tuesdays of month to discuss book choices. The "shoota gamma pool" group meets twice monthly after regular monthly lunches and Executive Board meetings. Dr Bob Bundy leads a group of bikers on rides in the county. Wine tasting outings are being explored by Dave Bernardi. Lucky 7 Golf will be starting weekly golf outings on March 5 at Foxtail North followed by Hiddenbrook on March 12, Windsor on March 19 and Rancho Solano on March 26. FEBRUARY SPEAKER

Jason Balderama, Chief Information Security Officer at the County of Marin, has over 23 years of experience in government IT, including 8 years in cybersecurity. He earned the <u>Certified Infor-</u> <u>mation Systems Security Professional</u> (<u>CISSP</u>) certification in 2013 and remains a member in good standing with ISC2. Jason was instrumental in establishing the County's firstever cybersecurity program in 2016, which has been continuously developed and matured under his guidance. Jason's efforts earned the Marin cybersecurity program the prestigious <u>California</u> <u>Association of Counties (CSAC) Challenge</u> <u>Award in 2019</u>.

Additionally, Jason spearheaded the creation of the Marin Information Security Collaboration (MISC), a groundbreaking initiative that united the County and its cities and towns in cybersecurity efforts. This initiative evolved into the <u>Marin</u> <u>Security and Privacy Council (MSPC)</u> in 2022, expanding its membership to include public and private sector organizations across the County. The MSPC was subsequently recognized with the Collaboration Award at the State of California Cybersecurity Education Summit in 2022. Jason also championed community outreach by launching the <u>Marin CyberSafe News</u> cybersecurity newsletter in January 2022, providing valuable resources to all County residents.

Jason's contributions extend beyond local impact, as evidenced by his co-chair role in the MS-ISAC Security Awareness Work Group for the past four years and active participation in the Bay Area Urban Areas Security Initiative (UASI). He is a frequent speaker at the California Counties Information Services Directors Association (CCISDSA) and is a key contributor to their Cybersecurity Work Group. Most recently, in March 2024, Jason partnered with the Bay Area UASI to host the region's first cybersecurity tabletop exercise at the Marin County Civic Center, further demonstrating his commitment to advancing cybersecurity collaboration and preparedness. It was labeled the largest and one of the best regional tabletop exercises in the state.
